
## The Summary of the Law

#### Sermon

**Nicene Creed** (all stand and recite in unison)

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, visible and invisible. We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only-begotten Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father; through him all things were made. For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven, was incarnate from the Holy Spirit and the Virgin Mary, and was made man. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate: he suffered death and was buried. On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end. We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father [and the Sonl, who with the Father and the Son is worshiped and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets. We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church. We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen.



On the night that he was betrayed, our Lord Jesus Christ took bread; and when he had given thanks, he broke it,\* and gave it to his disciples, saying, "Take, eat; this is my Body which is given for you: Do this in remembrance of me."

Likewise, after supper, Jesus took the cup, and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, saying, "Drink this, all of you; for this is my Blood of the New Covenant, which is shed for you, and for many, for the forgiveness of sins: Whenever you drink it, do this in remembrance of me."

Therefore we proclaim the mystery of faith:

## Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again.

We celebrate the memorial of our redemption, O Father, in this sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving, and we offer you these gifts.

Sanctify them by your Word and Holy Spirit to be for your people the Body and Blood of your Son Jesus Christ. Sanctify us also, that we may worthily receive this holy sacrament, and be made one body with him, that he may dwell in us and we in him. In the fullness of time, put all things in subjection under your Christ, and bring us with all your saints into the joy of your heavenly kingdom, where we shall see our Lord face to face.

All this we ask through your Son Jesus Christ: By him, and with him, and in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honor and glory is yours, Almighty Father, now and for ever. **Amen.**



## A note regarding this morning's Prelude and Postlude

The prelude this morning comes from Bach's Orgelbüchlein, (The Liturgical Year), and is set as a Nunc Dimittis. A beautiful and profound setting of the chorale, three ideas are presented. A double melody in the soprano and alto; the counterpoint in the tenor descriptive of the turmoil and weariness in the life of man, presenting a picture of an erring mortal who cannot through his own efforts find satisfaction; and finally, the wavering and syncopated steps of the bass symbolize mental weariness and a lack of energy. The text is as follows: Lord God, now open wide Thy Heaven, My parting hour is near; My course is run, enough I've striven, Enough I've suffered here; Weary and sad, My soul is glad That she may lay her down to rest; Now all on earth I can resign, But only let Thy Heaven be mine.

The postlude is perhaps one of Bach's most joyous chorale preludes, with a recurring joy motif in the pedal. The expression of joy is obvious and reflective of the text of this hymn: In Thee is gladness amid all sadness, Jesus, sunshine of my heart. By thee are given the gifts of heaven, Thou the true Redeemer art. Our souls Thou wakest, our bonds Thou breakest, who trusts Thee surely hath built securely, He stands forever. Alleluia! Our hearts are pining to see Thy shining, dying or living, to Thee are cleaving, naught can us sever. Alleluia!

## Reading While Black - Book Discussion Groups

Several groups are forming within our parish to read and discuss a new book by the Rev. Canon Esau McCaulley, PhD--a New Testament scholar and priest in the ACNA.

<u>Reading While Black: African American Biblical Interpretation as an Exercise in Hope</u> looks at the tradition of African American biblical interpretation and argues that the Bible rightly understood and read from a decidedly black perspective can speak a word of hope to African Americans in the United States.

Dr. McCaulley currently serves as assistant professor of New Testament at Wheaton College and completed his doctoral studies at the University of St. Andrews under the direction of N.T. Wright, who says of this new book, "Esau McCaulley's voice is one we urgently need to hear. This book is prophetic, biblical, measured, wise, friendly, and well-reasoned—and thus all the more hard-hitting. A powerful word for our times."

We look forward to learning together how our black Christian brothers and sisters interpret and are shaped by Scripture.
