Second Reading

After this I looked, and there was a great multitude that no one could count, from every nation, from all tribes and peoples and languages, standing before the throne and before the Lamb, robed in white, with palm branches in their hands. We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, visible and invisible. We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only-begotten Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father; through him all things were made. For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven, was incarnate from the Holy Spirit and the Virgin Mary, and was made man. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered death and was buried. On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end. 

Sanctify us also, that we may worthily receive this holy sacrament, and be made one body with him, that he may dwell in us and we in him. In the fullness of time, put all things in subjection under your Christ, and bring us with all your saints into the joy of your heavenly kingdom, where we shall see our Lord face to face.



ANNOUNCEMENTS

A note regarding this morning's offertory

Fredrik Melius Christiansen was born in 1871 in Eidsvold, Norway and passed away in 1955 in Northfield, Minnesota, He trained as a violinist, clarinetist, organist, and composer from a very early age. At the age of 17, he immigrated to the US to live with family while trying to gain footing as a church organist. Due to difficulty finding positions in Oakland, California, he moved in with his brother who lived in Wisconsin. It was there where he saw a singing group from Augsburg College and was immediately drawn to Augsburg to study music. Christiansen spent one year at Augsburg College in Minneapolis before transferring to Northwestern Conservatory of Music to complete his Bachelor's Degree with honors in music theory and counterpoint. In 1897, he moved to Leipzig, Germany, with his newly wedded wife, to study at the Royal Conservatory of Music. Following graduation, he returned to Minnesota where he became a professor of violin all while playing the organ at his church and directing the Kjerulf Male Chorus. A few years following his teaching appointment, the President of St. Olaf University personally recruited Christiansen to St Olaf. It was there where he founded and conducted the now world-renowned St. Olaf Chorus. He held the position of the St. Olaf Chorus conductor for 30 years along with adding band director and department head to his duties. Within the choral world, he is considered a pioneer of the art of a cappella choral singing. Of note, among his seven children, two continued in his footsteps of conducting choral ensembles. His son, Paul, conducted the Concordia Choir (from Moorhead, Minnesota) from 1937 until 1986, while another of his sons, Olaf, took over following his father's retirement in 1943 as the conductor of the St. Olaf Choir until Olaf's own retirement in 1968.

From his F. Melius Christiansen's biography on the St. Olaf website:

A description of Dr. Christiansen while conducting a rehearsal has been given by a visiting music critic as follows:

"A strikingly calm, cool exterior might easily mislead the careless observer into a belief that the celebrated Minnesota Kapellmeister is a musician of the purely scientific, intellectual variety. But a view of his face while he conducts a rehearsal, a glimpse of his eyes as he discusses some great composer, the tone of his voice as he expounds the great principles underlying his work, these tell the story of an ever-burning spiritual flame which now and again reaches white heat."

Regarding this morning's piece, their conductor Oscar Overby to the surprise of Christiansen who sat at the organ console premiered it in the St. Olaf Chapel. In Overby's book, *The Years in Retrospect*, he recounts his trepidation in approaching Christiansen after the performance, hoping he had not given offence at preempting the premiere.

"I found the master stooped over at the organ, unable to speak; his face was wet with tears – the only time I saw him weep and shed tears visibly. I stood helpless during the silent moments that followed; I felt as if I stood on sacred ground. He finally regained his composure and muttered softly under his breath: "Thank you! Did I write that?"

Columbarium Niches Are Now Available

Have you have seen our new columbarium in place in the Narthex and wondered what is a columbarium? A columbarium is a structure for the respectful storage of funerary urns holding cremated remains of the deceased. Our columbarium is now available, and the first niches have already been reserved. Many of us have already made plans for the final disposition of our remains – burial or cremation – and final resting place. Making these arrangements before we die takes that burden off loved ones after our deaths. For those who have not yet made these important plans, now a new option is available, inurnment of ashes in our own family church columbarium. The cost to reserve niches is \$800 for a single niche, or \$1,300 if two niches are reserved at the same time.

Please prayerfully consider your wishes for the disposition of your own remains. Let your family know! If inurnment at Christ Church is your choice, please contact the church office for application forms.
